Methodology

Equivalent Format Comparison (EFC): BioPak specification unit mass vs industry conventional packaging mass for the matched format, plus fossil polymer estimate using typical PE/PS/PP fractions. SKU BB-CBL-S weight from BioPak specifications. Indicative estimate only - not a certified life-cycle assessment (ISO 14040/14044). Compares BioPak published unit masses to conventional equivalent-format benchmarks used in Australian

foodservice (PE-lined cups, PP clamshells, PS lids). For procurement reporting, request substantiated SKU documentation from Sip and Pak. Typically within $\pm 15\%$ for fossil polymer estimate when a BioPak SKU and format benchmark both match.
